How to Order

Pot Sizes

3.5 inch: Pint pot 1.0pt., 18 per tray. Groundcovers such as Liriope, Pachysandra, and Vinca. We also use this pot for custom grown material.

QT: Quart pot 1.01qt., 10 per tray. Early spring blooming varieties, groundcovers, Sedum, and Sempervivum. Great for a quick turn during the busiest months of the season. Sedum and Sempervivum grow well in smaller pots as they can't get overwatered easily.

JS: Janor thermoformed square pot 2.00 qt., 8 per tray in a cavity tray. We grow a large selection of plants that bloom in April–May in this square pot. 20% more pots will fit in a sales display compared to our Jumbo round pots.

JR: Jumbo round pot 2.55 qt., 6 per tray. Also referred to as a "cheater gallon" or a #1 pot. With a bit more volume than our JS pot, varieties that bloom in June–September hold up well in this size. We also pot new crops for summer and fall availability into this pot.

1G: True 1 gallon pot 1.00 gal. Perennials love the ample volume to produce large root systems and plenty of flowers.

2G: Trade 2 gallon pot 1.50 gal. Larger perennials, grasses, Peonies, and summer crops for instant color.

3G: Trade 3 gallon pot 2.80 gal. For larger perennials, especially those that mature in August–September or with large root systems.

We are experienced in supplying custom grown perennials from plugs to 5 gallon pots. With enough lead time we can grow almost anything! We will be happy to quote on custom grown orders for both retail and landscape projects.

Ordering

All orders (delivery or customer pickup) should be submitted in pot quantities to your salesperson. For packing efficiency and to eliminate partial trays of plants, we ask that you order in the following multiples whenever possible:

- 3.5 inch pots..... 18 per tray

Minimum Orders

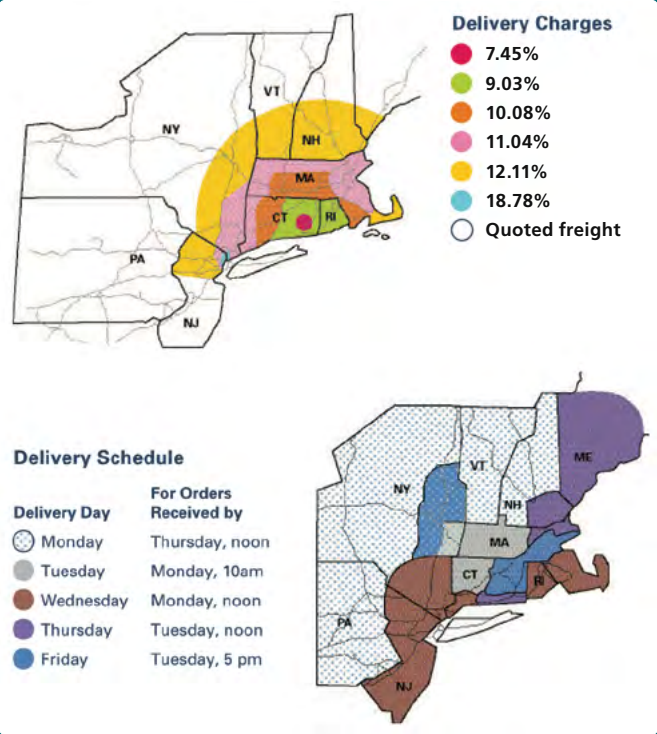
There is no minimum order for items picked up at our nursery. For delivered orders the minimum order is \$1,000.00 during the busy season of April–May. Beginning in June there is no minimum order for delivery, but the \$100 minimum delivery fee applies to all delivered orders.

Shipping

Our weekly delivery schedule means you can count on The Plant Group to be there with your plants. Remember that in order to provide this level of service, orders must be received before the deadline shown next to each delivery day. We try our best to accommodate every situation but sometimes we run out of daylight. We deliver to areas outside of the colored map but not necessarily on a weekly basis. Contact your salesperson for a truck schedule for these areas.

Our minimum shipping charge is \$100. Orders can also be picked up at the nursery if you call ahead. Most of our deliveries are done using tractor-trailer combinations in order to fit the greatest number of plants or deliveries on a truck. Delivery charges are invoiced as a percentage of the order total depending on the distance from The Plant Group. Please refer to the Delivery Charges map for specific rates.

Delivery to Long Island, Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket, or areas outside of the colored map can be quoted by your salesperson.



Pricing

Terms

For new customers our terms are COD until a credit line can be established. A credit application is available from our office or any salesperson. Cash, credit cards, or checks are accepted. Once credit is established, 1.5% interest per month will be charged on past due accounts.

Quantity Discounts

Please refer to the discount table below for your earned quantity discount. Quantity discounts are based on the previous year's total sales and apply to all orders (regardless of size) placed the following year. We will notify you in November of your earned discount for the following year.

- 3% for purchases exceeding \$11,000.00
- 4% for purchases exceeding \$16,500.00
- 6% for purchases exceeding \$22,000.00

Quantity discounts apply only to orders paid within terms.

End of Year Rebates

Customers having total yearly sales exceeding \$44,000 will receive an additional 2% rebate on invoices paid within terms. Customers having total yearly sales exceeding \$82,500 will receive an additional 4% rebate on invoices paid within terms. Rebates will be distributed about November 1 each year.

Guarantee

We certify that our plants are delivered in first rate condition and are correctly identified. Should we fail to meet these goals, notify us and we will pick them up for a full refund or promptly replace them.
